#### Less free world

Authoritarian governments
Freedom House: global freedom declined
USA downgraded to "flawed" democracy
Centralised control in China, Russia, Turkey
Hungary and Poland moved in authoritarian directions
The "Arab spring" became an "Arab winter"

Governments impose strict limits on citizens' freedom
